

Pupil attendance is good. This is vital, as there is a strong correlation between attendance and student performance.

Though examination results are not the only evidence of a school's success, they are very important indicators of achievement. Results at Reepham High School and College remain strong with the majority of our pupils following traditional academic curriculum.

The success of a school can of course be measured in many other ways. The prowess shown on the sports fields of the county, the contribution made to musical events, or the links with the community are some of the ways in which a school can be deemed to be successful. Reepham High School and College is well ordered and characterised by excellent pupil behaviour. Pupils are very happy at Reepham High School and College.

Our curriculum aims to support our pupils' academic growth by providing a well-rounded education that helps pupils achieve their full potential and successfully transition to the next phase of their education or career. Year 7 pupils are taught largely in mixed ability classes with the exception of Maths and Science where they are set, based on both prior and current working levels. Pupils are placed in tutor groups, which largely remain the same for KS3 before switching to new tutor groups once they start GCSE courses in Year 10, that are bespoke to the subject combinations they take.

In Years 10 and 11 pupils will study a combination of compulsory and preference subjects. All pupils will need to study the same core subjects:

In Year 9 pupils select four subject preferences that they will study at GCSE alongside the Compulsory Subjects. Most pupils will take 9 GCSEs in total. However, the top performing Scientists and Mathematicians will take Triple Science and Further Maths, giving them an additional two GCSEs. Additionally, where appropriate, some pupils will take one less preference and in its place receive additional support with English and Maths.

Currently we ask pupils to select at least one of the following GCSEs as a preference: Computer Science, French, Geography, History or Spanish. However, they can select more than one of these if they so desire.

Year 9 pupils complete an initial survey on the preference subjects they would like to continue with at GCSE. From this we build the preference blocking form, from which students make their final selection. This supports us each year, in ensuring that Reepham pupils are able to study as many of their first-choice preferences as possible.

#### **Sports Clubs & Competitive Success**

Our sports clubs offer something for everyone whether pupils are just looking to try something new or aiming for top performances. From football, netball, athletics, cricket, rugby, to handball, we cater to all abilities. Our teams compete regularly in county level tournaments, often bringing home trophies and honours a testament to pupils' dedication and the quality of our coaching. Through sport, pupils gain more than fitness: leadership, resilience, teamwork, and self discipline are among the life skills they carry forward.

These activities bring additional benefits: pupils grow personally gaining confidence, creativity, self discipline, they form strong relationships across year groups, and all find balance and enjoyment amid busy academic lives.

We encourage every pupil to participate in at least one extra curricular activity. Whether your passion lies in sport, arts, performance or leadership, there is a place here for you to grow, excel and enjoy yourself.

#### Subject Trips & Curriculum Enhancement Week

We believe learning comes alive when pupils can see and experience their subjects in real settings.

That's why we run a broad programme of subject trips throughout the year, along with an annual Curriculum Enhancement Week to deepen understanding, spark curiosity, and stretch horizons.

In our subject trips pupils get hands on experiences that directly tie into their studies: History pupils visit the World War I battlefields at Ypres; Year 7 explore Anglo Saxon life at West Stow; Geography pupils investigate the North Norfolk coast; Maths pupils visit Bletchley Park and Norwich Castle to link theory and problem solving to real places; Modern Foreign Languages pupils participate in exchanges abroad; PE pupils take ski and netball tours; English and Art pupils enjoy both local and national theatre performances and gallery visits, bringing literature, drama and visual arts to life.

Each summer, during Curriculum Enhancement Week, pupils can choose immersive, adventurous options. Many take part in residential trips to places such as Normandy, Spain or the Peak District, where themes from across the curriculum are reinforced through outdoor learning, cultural engagement and challenge. Meanwhile, local excursions made to sites of historic, environmental or artistic interest allow pupils to connect more closely with their studies, make real world connections, and enrich their knowledge and understanding.

These trips and enhancement experiences don't just support academic learning they also foster independence, resilience, and global awareness. They help pupils grow in confidence and build cultural understanding.

#### **Careers and Work Experience:**

At our school we pride ourselves on excellent career provision that supports pupils at every stage. All pupils participate in a careers programme, with Year 10 and Year 12 pupils completing work experience. We host a vibrant careers fair each year, bringing together employers, further and higher education providers, and apprenticeship routes, so pupils can explore their options first hand. We are very proud to meet all eight Gatsby Benchmarks.

At Reepham High School and College, the wellbeing, safety, and growth of every pupil are central to all we do. Our pastoral care system is designed to support pupils academically, socially, emotionally and morally, ensuring that each one feels known, valued and safe.

#### **Dedicated Pastoral Team**

For each year group we have non teaching Student Managers who are available across the whole school day. These managers are a first port of call for parents/carers and support pupils with day-to-day pastoral needs.

The Designated Safeguarding Leads including our Deputy Head for Pastoral, ensure that all concerns about pupils' safety and welfare are dealt with sensitively and promptly.

#### **Student Services Hub**

Pastoral, attendance, safeguarding and SEND (Special Educational Needs & Disabilities) support are housed in our Student Services building. This centralised facility ensures coordination, consistency, and quick responses.

The vast majority of Year 11 pupils enrol at our highly successful sixth form. As Ofsted commented

At our sixth form college students will find like minded individuals and a positive learning environment. They will be supported, well taught, helped to develop as a person and feel proud of their achievements when they leave.

Reepham College has consistently been one of the top performing sixth forms in the Eastern region since it opened in 2009. The results of our students place us in the top 25% in the country. This is extremely impressive when you consider that there is no selective admissions programme and students follow a traditional academic curriculum.



However, we know success is more than just grades. Whether their ambition is university, an apprenticeship, or stepping into the world of work, we will help guide and support students. Student progress from our College to prestigious universities such as Oxford, Cambridge and Russell Group and highly competitive apprenticeships such as with Rolls Royce.

We offer a range of academic A Level courses, alongside an enrichment programme designed to provide opportunities to volunteer, experience teamwork, develop leadership skills and build confidence.
